It is established in 1956 by Founder president Dr. V. T. patil and International Educationalist Dr. J. P. Naik . According to NCFTE 2014 Communication Skill is an important component of Two Year B. Ed. Degree course for pedagogy students .It is one of the important aspect of Enhancing Professional Capacities (EPC) Pedagogy of English is a paper for Semester II and semesterIII and for semester IV as Optional paper. **OBJECTIVE OF THE PRACTICE:** (1) To develop Listening , speaking, reading , writing communication skill in English (2) To develop group interaction skill (3) To develop planning skill (4) To develop study skills in English (5) To improve linguistic competence of student teachers. **NEED OF THE PRACTICE** It is the subjective experience of the teacher trainer that enrolled students in English Pedagogy are found to be weak in English communication. it is important to develop LSRWC of the students in the beginning stage.
